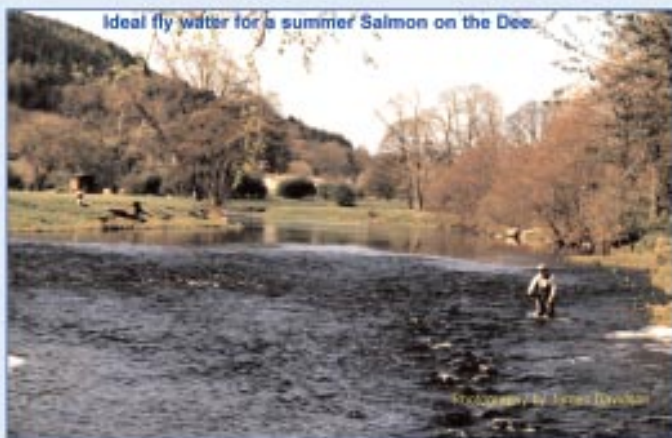


# Wirral Game Fishing Club

Exclusive fishing at affordable prices



Prime beats for salmon, sea trout and trout on the rivers Dee, Conwy, Clwyd, Elwy and Lledr with additional rods on Brenig and a club lake.

Wirral Game Fishing Club was formed nearly 30 years ago to provide quality game fishing for discerning local anglers and it is now considered to be the premier game fishing club in North Wales.

The good reputation that the Club has built up over the years, is very jealously guarded by strict adherence to Club rules and the Countryside Code. Riparian Owners appreciate this and waters are leased to WGFC that would normally only be made available to private individuals or a small syndicate.

WGFC. has a variety of prime beats available to its members, offering quality game fishing on the Rivers Dee, Conwy, Clwyd, Lledr and Elwy.

There is a well stocked trout lake available exclusively for use by WGFC members and a rod allocation on Llyn Brenig. In addition to the wealth of Salmon, Sea and Brown Trout sport available on all WGFC beats, the River Dee in particular offers one of the premier Grayling fishing opportunities in the country.

## Summary of available fishing at WGFC

- 2x Prime beat of the upper river Dee.
- 4x Prime beats of the middle river Dee.
- 1x Prime beat of the lower river Dee.
- 1x 2.5miles on the river Lledr
- 1x Beat on river Clwyd.
- 4x Beat on river Elwy
- 1x Beat on river Conwy below Betws-y-Coed.
- 1x Beat on river Conwy above Betws-y-Coed.



### Still waters

- 4x Rods on Llyn Brenig (international class still-water fishing)
- 6 x Rods on Clubs own exclusive trout lake (Boats available free)

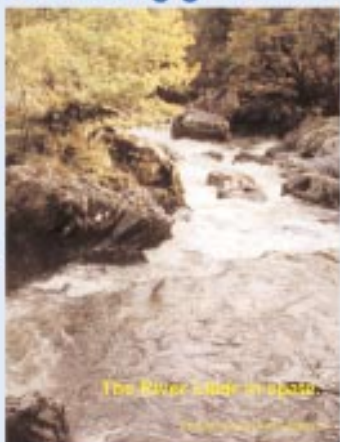

The number of rods available per beat is carefully regulated by the Club to ensure quality fishing for all its members. Because of WGFC's commitment to its member's sport a 24 hour telephone booking service is available for their convenience 365 days a year.

Monthly meetings and restricted recruitment has created a uniquely 'small club' sense of unity and exclusivity.

Guest speakers at each meeting give talks on matters as diverse as 'Boat fishing at Llyn Brenig- Tactics, methods and flies', 'Brown trout fishing in Tasmania' and 'The evolution of the double handed rod over the last 30 years'

### Salmon

Our beats include some of the best salmon water in the North of Wales. Salmon can be expected in all our river beats.

### Sea trout

The Elwy and Conwy are renowned sea trout rivers and we have night fishing available on these waters. The Conwy, in particular, is noted for large sea trout.

### Trout

Brenig is an internationally renowned large reservoir of some 920 acres. This fly-only reservoir is stocked with rainbow trout and brown trout, with many of the latter being wild fish. Both bank and boat fishing are available.

The club lake is set in the beautiful Clwyd valley, near Denbigh. This two acre spring-fed lake is an exquisite spot to spend a carefree day tempting rainbow trout with buzzers, dry fly, nymphs or even lures and can be fished from the bank or one of the boats.

### Grayling

Our upper Dee beats contain some of the finest grayling fishing available in the country. Andy Nicholson's video, "The Lady of the Stream" was filmed entirely upon club waters.

### Questions and Answers for prospective members

- Q. How many members are there?  
A. The Club is restricted to 150 fishing members with a handful of honorary and social members.
- Q. How often and where do members meet?  
A. We meet monthly at a local hostelry during which we have guest speakers, demonstrations and an annual tackle auction.
- Q. How does your booking system work?  
A. You phone a dedicated number and request to fish a given beat or lake for a given date. Only one booking can be made at a time! If however there is a vacancy on another beat after 9am before the date you have booked you can also fish that beat.
- Q. It all sounds very expensive, is it?  
A. No, the annual subscription is less than any named day fishing on the River Dee, or for a season ticket on a large still water.
- Q. How do I join?  
A. Fill out the form supplied, return it and the Club will contact you.
